Saint Luke's Announces Building Healthy Community and Second Quarter Grants
\$1 million allocated for "Building Healthy Communities" projects

CLEVELAND, July 9, 2007 – The Saint Luke's Foundation of Cleveland, Ohio has announced \$1.4 million in grants in support of programs and initiatives that align with the Foundation's mission of improving and transforming the health and well being of individuals, families and communities throughout Greater Cleveland. The grants represent programs and initiatives awarded through the Foundation's community grants program, as well as through a special 10th anniversary allocation designed to recognize programs and service enhancements focused on building healthy communities.

"In recognition of the Foundation's 10th anniversary, our trustees earmarked \$1 million to fund programs aimed at building healthy communities," said Denise San Antonio Zeman, president and CEO of the Saint Luke's Foundation. "We received more than 130 innovative responses to the 10th anniversary RFP, and we are thrilled to now publicly acknowledge ten programs that represent a diverse range of issues, size and project scope. Collectively," Ms. Zeman added, "these programs will truly go a long way toward transforming the health and well being of neighborhoods in Greater Cleveland."

The Foundation awarded special one-time 10th anniversary grants to the following:

ParkWorks	\$150,000	for the Strengthening Neighborhoods Initiative
Joseph's Home	\$60,000	for operating support
Greater Cleveland Habitat for Humanity	\$59,000	for sponsorship of a Cleveland Habitat home and garages
Cuyahoga County	\$150,000	for the Health Access Initiative
Cuyahoga County Family-to-Family Administrator's Council	\$120,000	for the Neighbor-to-Neighbor program
Hospice of the Western Reserve	\$114,105	for the Collaborative Demonstration Project to provide end-of-life education and support to persons with Alzheimer's and their caregivers

Cleveland Housing Network	\$124,700	for capacity building
Golden Age Centers of Greater Cleveland	\$124,336	for the Greater Cleveland Evening Home Delivered Meal Program
Cleveland Hearing & Speech Center	\$33,136	for the 'Communication Kiosks program

Grants awarded through this \$1 million allocation are above and beyond the foundation's regular grantmaking efforts for 2007. Programs chosen for the 10th anniversary grants will be showcased at The Saint Luke's Foundation's annual meeting on September 10, 2007.

Second Quarter Grants Announced

The Foundation also awarded seven community grants, including \$30,000 to St. Vincent Charity Hospital for the Marion-Sterling Community Partnership At-Risk Youth Program; \$75,000 to the Cleveland Furniture Bank for capacity building; and \$78,179 to Project LEARN for its Reading Health Program.
